The proposed uranium mining in our area no doubt poses a unique threat to Northern Colorado's groundwater and waterways. Even the so touted innocuous technology called "in-situ mining" has a dirty past.

In Wyoming, a well known in situ mining operation was cited by the Department of Environmental Quality because of the slow pace of groundwater restoration of well-fields. They were so far out of compliance regarding the time table in their permits, that it warranted an investigation of the mine and reclamation plans. With information from the Land Quality Division they identified numerous violations, and citations were issued. (Docket N. 4231-08)

As quoted in the docket, "plans contained in the permit documents are dated and incomplete in numerous ways". To name a few: spill detection, reporting, and follow-up protocols were not defined, ground water restoration procedure, necessary facilities, lack of thorough descriptions and time schedules for restoration, and more. Also, the Land Quality Division "identified serious deficiencies with both permits".

As a result, the state of Wyoming has now spent valuable resources and time to help protect the people of that state because of unsafe and poorly regulated mining practices.

Science has never proven that a working In situ mining operation is not toxic to the environment. There have been failures to communities in Wyoming, Texas, and Colorado, to name a few. Permits have not been clear allowing companies to skirt out of their responsibilities.

I am opposed to uranium mining this close to communities. And I implore you to make sure that, when these rules for HB 1161 are written they are clear and do not allow modifications by the mining companies along the way.

It is imperative that the water be restored to it's original quality and that the water standard is not relaxed at any point. Water standards must be exactly that of pre-mining values. I urge you to make sure the language in these rules does not allow changes in the time lines, water standards, reporting, reclamations, to name a few.

Another issue of concern on this same topic is: Colorado Senate Bill 08-228 regarding the veil of secrecy when a mining company is prospecting to do mining.

I ask that the MLRB rules ratify the current staff practice of accepting public and local government comments on prospecting activities and reject the industries attempts to eliminate all public involvement for any pre-mining approvals.

Pre-mining activities often have the potential to result in negative impacts on our air and water quality. It this potential, and as our rights as citizens, that we be given the opportunity to be informed of prospecting approvals such as in situ mining.

In addition, the MLRB rules should expressly provide the public and local governments the opportunity to seek administrative review of prospecting approvals as well as in-situ baseline characterization plan approvals.

I am a medical professional and love living in Northern Colorado. I am genuinely concerned about the serious negative impacts operations such as uranium mining can have on our health and overall way of life.
